Mr. Simon Coveney T.D. Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine, was first elected to the Dáil (Irish Parliament) in 1998 as one of Fine Gael's youngest TD's. Since then, he has held Shadow Ministries in the many areas including: Drugs and Youth Affairs; Communications, Marine and Natural Resources; Transport and the Marine. Mr. Coveney was appointed as Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine on March 9th 2011. He holds a B.Sc. in Agriculture and Land Management from The Royal Agriculture College,



Gloucestershire and was also educated at Clongowes Wood College, Co. Kildare; University College Cork and Gurteen Agricultural College, Co. Tipperary. Mr. Coveney continues to be involved in the running of a family farm in Co.Cork.

Ella McSweeney is an acclaimed Irish radio and TV broadcaster with a love for farming, agri-business, wildlife, food and environmental issues and programming. Her background is in science (zoology) and she spent three years working for BBC before moving back to Ireland in 2004 to work with RTE.
